## MOD must 'urgently resolve' Right to Remain for Commonwealth veterans, MPs warn, after Royal Navy becomes latest force to be pulled into immigration row

Exclusive: Veteran face deportation after Ministry of Defence 'failed to inform him' of immigration proceedings

The Ministry of Defence must “urgently resolve” the Right to Remain issue for Commonwealth veterans, MPs have warned, after the Royal Navy became the latest force to be pulled into the

immigration row.

Mark Waiganjo, 37, who served in the Royal Navy as a team medic for seven years, has accused the MOD of failing to inform him of the correct procedures he was required to follow in order to process his immigration status to permanent residency in the UK.

Mr Waiganjo, who moved from Kenya to London in 2006 to study law, said he felt he had suffered the “biggest injustice”.

“I am in disbelief at the way I've been treated and how my life now has been turned upside down even after the service, the commitment, the sacrifice and honor that I had to do for God and Country,” Mr Waiganjo told The Telegraph....
